McMurry SSS Grant

- SSS = Student Support Services
- \$261, 888 per year for 5 years
- Focus on academic development and to motivate students toward the successful completion of their postsecondary education.
- Complements and enhances Mindset for Success (QEP)
- Began September 1, 2020
- Hiring 3.5 new staff members to support the program



McMurry Title V Engineering Grant

- Engineering focused
- New major to launch in Fall 22 Engineering Physics
- \$600,000 per year for 5 years
- All to McMurry
- Additional support including academic advising, professional tutoring, summer bridge program for calculus
- Facility renovation
- Integration with local business community
- Began September 1, 2020

- 1,023 FTE

Coronavirus Update

- Currently: 5 Recoveries and 4 Active cases
- Approx. 40 students currently in quarantine
 - ➤ Update to quarantine guidelines based on DSHS
- Proper social distancing and mask wearing in the classroom is more important than ever
- Locally, cases are trending down
 - ➤ Rolling average for PCR is 4.3 cases
 - ➤ Rolling 7-day average (PCR + antigen) 19.43 cases



 Will there be cuts on faculty lines for the next academic year?

Clarification on the Friday of Homecoming Weekend.
 There has been some confusion between the Academic Calendar and some of the messaging from other campus groups. What have Freshmen been told in Freshman Seminar? Are we having classes?



 I have been receiving questions from the faculty about McMurry's "plan" regarding a shutdown over COVID cases. Faculty are wondering what our "critical number" is in order to trigger a decision to go completely remote.

• Is there a chance that we will finish school in person this semester? Is it more likely that we will finish this semester online rather than in person?



 Is there a way for students to submit a complaint about masks not being worn in public hang out areas such as the nest?

Completely anonymous. The reporter will be assigned a case number and can follow up on actions taken or next steps.



 Do students go through any kind of process or approval to leave campus when they are quarantined? I have had several students who never showed symptoms who went home for their quarantine but have no internet service at home. Are they advised of the need to stay connected online?



- Isolate: Individual tested positive for COVID-19.
 - ➤ Required to isolate for 10 days from positive test whether they show symptoms or not, the positive test triggers isolation.
- Quarantine: Individual exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19 through close contact.
 - ➤ Required to quarantine for 14 days from exposure to positive individual.
 - Exposure can be in the classroom, residence hall, off campus event, etc.



- Close Contact Guidelines Updated September 16
 - ➤ Based off of new information from the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS). The quarantine halo continues to be within six feet for longer than 15 minutes of the tested-positive individual. If students are sitting at a distance of at least six feet in the classroom from the tested-positive individual and wearing masks, the DSHS does not consider this close contact.
 - This makes the 6 foot distance and mask policy more important than ever.
